



With 71 centres reporting data for 11 637 cycles with oocyte retrieval

953 CYCLES to OR were reported for chromosomal abnormalities,

144 CYCLES to OR for sexing for X-linked diseases,

3445 CYCLES to OR for monogenic diseases,

6095 CYCLES to OR for PGS,

38 CYCLES to OR for social sexing

Use of arrays for genetic testing increased from $4\% \ge 20\%$ in PGS and from 6% 13% in PGD cycles for chromosomal abnormalities

MEDIA ATTENTION

The article: 'Early menarche (<11v) and nulliparity are associated with higher risk of premature and early menopause', achieved an Altmetric score of 718 and 510 page views after a press release on January 25th 2017, and was mentioned by 90 news outlets.

The article; 'Genetic diseases and aneuploidies can be detected with a single blastocyst biopsy: a successful clinical approach', achieved an Altmetric score of 65 after a press release on June 13th and being picked up by 7 news outlets.

An article published in November; Vitamin D and assisted reproductive treatment outcome: a systematic review and meta-analysis', received media attention following a press release on November 15th 2017. As of January 9th 2018, the article had an Altmetric score of 290 and was mentioned by 35 news outlets.

The HRU article: 'Temporal trends in sperm count: a systematic review and meta-regression analysis', was covered by 324 news outlets, on 23 blogs, mentioned by 356 tweeters and on 40 Facebook pages. This has led to the article having an impressive Altmetric score of 3023 (as of January 5 2018), ranking 26th in the Altmetric top 100 articles for 2017
